Centre perspective of the tracking system webinars

As most of you will know, the IT skills tracking system now hosts the majority of our training and resources. With this in mind and to ensure that you get the most out of the system we are now delivering regular webinars to show you what the tracking system can do.

We received great feedback from attendees on the first webinar, held on Tuesday 7 February. Sharon Lythgoe attended the session and has given us her thoughts below:

Q: What were your expectations of the webinar before attending it?

A: I expected to gain a greater understanding of how to use the system better and also to get a feel for how other centres were using the system.

Q: What did you know of the tracking system and how were you using it?

A: I was mainly using it for TNA's as we have a large implementation coming up this year. The TNA will identify people who require basic skills training and we will offer these learners NHS ELITE. We aim to use the system as a learning tool in the classroom so that users are interacting with the same system from the beginning of their learning with support from a trainer.

Q: How did you find the webinar?

A: Very useful, I gained a greater understanding of how the system works and it was useful to hear how others are using it. Also it's great to see that the Ready for MOST materials are now available, I feel as a service we are neglecting Microsoft training due to the pressure of training on clinical systems. I was also joined on the webinar by three members of my team; my deputy and two trainers and they found it equally as

Q: What did you learn about the IT skills tracking system?

A: We had managed to tailor a TNA but rather clumsily so we now understand it a lot better. We're now able to edit our details which has enabled us to make the training more bespoke to our

Trust. We've also learnt how to use the links and the registrations and to add questions in for the users. This is really useful stuff, particularly for us doing TNAs as it's a nightmare matching staff to a staff list, now we can gather the information we need at the start. Reporting is really time consuming so these tools are really powerful.

Q: What benefits do you now expect to see?

A: Greater use of the system, from a trainer and also a learner perspective, better data analysis, and generally it will enable us to offer a better service to our users.

Excel and Office Essentials Ready for MOST elearning released

We have recently released Ready for MOST (RFM) Word and PowerPoint 2007 elearning content onto the IT skills tracking system. We are pleased to announce that the final two RFM modules, Excel and Office Essentials, will be available on the tracking system in early March.

Office Essentials covers key and often reoccurring elements within Office applications such as starting and closing applications and using the ribbon. It is also an ideal training tool for using with learners that are migrating to the newest versions of Office.

Ready for MOST (level 1) is a set of learning materials that has been specifically designed to bridge the gap that exists between NHS ELITE (entry level) and the full NHS MOST (level 2 and 3) training.

The materials have been produced by University Hospitals of Morecambe Bay NHS Foundation Trust with the input of the NHS IT skills development design group. In addition, a few of our training centres kindly offered their time to assist the design group to review the materials. We would like to send our thanks to those training centres and the design group members for their help.
