# **NHS Networks for IT Training Professionals**

We've had requests in the past for a forum for centres to share ideas, documents and implementation plans. We think we have found the answer to these requests in the form of NHS Networks.

NHS Networks is described as "a great way to connect people who share an interest and want to get things done. It's also useful for existing networks and organisations who want to promote discussion, get feedback and extend their reach beyond organisational boundaries."



The NHS IT Training Professionals group on NHS Networks now has a section for the IT Skills Pathway. This group provides support for NHS IT Training Professionals delivering clinical systems and other IT related training: a place to discuss and share training materials, ideas, development opportunities, updates and other information.

The IT Skills Pathway section will allow pathway centres to hold discussions with other centres as well as a place for uploading and sharing useful documents. It also gives the national team a way of making meeting notes, slides etc. available as well as holding polls and discussions on IT Skills related topics.

The January IT Skills Pathway Tracking System webinar will be held on Tuesday 21 January.



### And the Results are in ...

It's not quite the X-Factor or Strictly Come Dancing, but we have now the results of our first annual survey.



Thanks to all those that took the time to complete the questions. A full report is being prepared but in the meantime, here are the headlines:-

- We had responses from 117 Organisations
- 97% of you are satisfied (over 80% being 'fairly' or 'totally' satisfied) with the products and services provided
- Over 50% of you utilise the IT Skills Pathway Tracking System as your primary or only source of training
- Only 4% of respondents stated they would be able to fund their own IT Skills programme if there was no central funding and provision of the IT Skills Pathway
