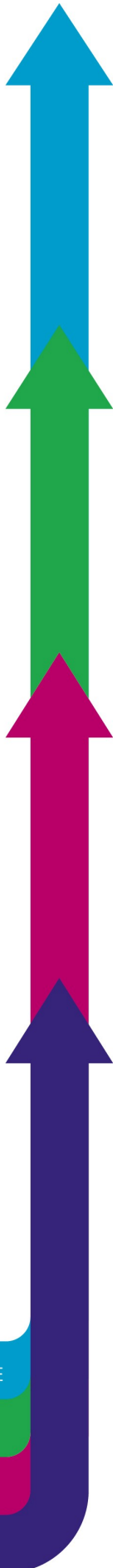

The search for the NHS MOST Champion 2012 has now concluded and we are delighted to announce the winner and two runners up.

Mathew Burt from Pennine Acute Hospitals NHS Trust took the top award. He is pictured here with his prize and trophy.

Matthew started in the NHS in February 2010 as a part of the Future Jobs Fund which was a six month government sponsored initiative to help people get back into employment. At the end of the scheme he was kept on in the same role.

commitment and high standards of our staff.

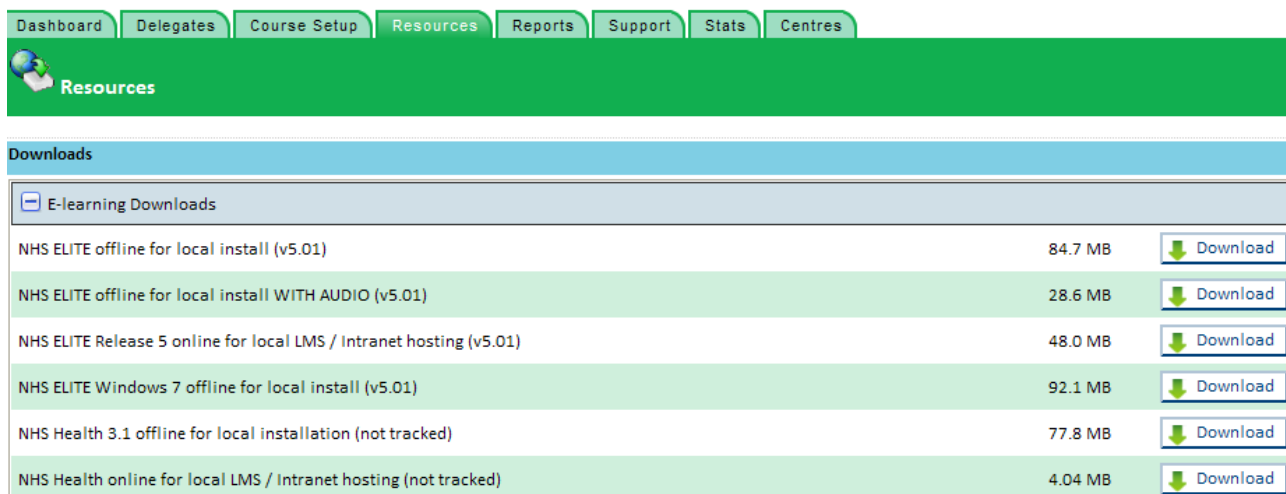

Downloading versions of learning materials

A few recent changes to the tracking system have meant that some of the versions of the learning materials will no longer work. This has affected the downloaded versions of the learning materials (not the ones that are launched through the tracking system), for example those used for installation to desktop or the audio version.

To rectify this you simply need to sign in to the tracking system and re-download them from the Resources Tab.

If you encounter any problems when downloading please raise a ticket through the Support Tab on the tracking system for assistance.

Did you know... that there are ways of using the learning materials from a desktop which will still allow you to track your learners? For example you could create your elearning link and store it in a Word document on the desktop, this way learners could use the link allowing you to still get all of the data about their progress and completions.

Testers needed for Excel Level Two Learning Materials

The Excel Level Two elearning materials are nearly ready for testing and as always we are looking for you to help us to test them. We will be releasing the materials on the 20 August and you would have two weeks (until 03 September) to test and send us your comments.

Extending the deadline for MOST Centre of Excellence awards

As you will already be aware, each year we award a Centre of Excellence plaque to any centre that delivers 100 exam passes in a year (July – June). This year we have decided to extend the deadline for reaching the 100 exam pass mark. Therefore, you will continue to accrue exam passes for this year until 31 October 2012.

So, all exam passes from 1 July 2011 until 31 October 2012 will count towards the Centre of Excellence target giving you more time to reach this figure and receive a plaque. (These figures will not count towards the “Best in Region” annual award).

Level name changes in tracking system

A small change has been made to the Course Setup options and Course Names within the tracking system. This change has been made to reflect the levels used within the IT Skills Pathway i.e. Level 1, Level 2 etc. Please feel free to continue marketing these courses using the old names if you prefer.

When creating new courses, you will note that the new names appear in the drop down list as per the screen shot below.
